# President's Report



In many ways, season 1993 has been disappointing. On the field, our First and Reserve Grade teams did not reach the heights expected of them. Our Monaro team struggled in Division 1. However, our Under 19 team kept the flag flying with a win in the pre-season carnival, followed by the Under 19 premiership.

Our major fund raiser (sponsorship), was handled by a Committee outside of the Football Club. Whilst it promised so much, little was produced. Additionally, the licenced Club is still unable to contribute financially to the running of the football operation. To enable recruitment and player payments to proceed, the major priority for our Club is to raise the football budget to about ninety thousand dollars a year. The Club needs to recruit three key players. This cannot be achieved on the present football budget.

The Club is fortunate to have an excellent group of workers involved in the day to day operation of the Club. Our training staff places us in a stronger position than other Clubs in the competition and our thanks are extended to Kimbo, Andy, Hawkes, Steve, our first female trainer, Peg Townley and last but not least, Max, who looked after the interests of our Monaro team. Frank Goddard and Neville Hickmott have been a tower of strength in the day to day running operations of the Club and I thank them both sincerely. Paul Gunn and Peter Schlesinger have been great workers on match days, along with Team Managers Tony Schell, Adam Jones, Les Craig and Neville Hickmott.

Leanne Weinert is co-ordinating our car raffles. This is a most important aspect of fund raising for the Club. I thank Leanne for her time and effort. We really do appreciate the support given by our Ladies Auxiliary. Their after match awards, after match drinks and two soup nights after training are much appreciated by the football Committee and players. Julieanne Hickmott carries out many tasks for the Club and we thank you Julieanne for your support.

To our senior coaches, Maurice Wingate, Leigh Mc.Phan, Neville Hickmott, Robert Pocock and Chairman of Selectors Tony Wheelens. The Club asks no more from its coaches than loyal and dedicated support. This has been provided at all times. I understand the problems associated with coaching a club with limited resources and I thank you all for a job well done.

Congratulations to all award winners in 1993 and as we prepare for next season, remember, obstacles are those frightful things you see when you take your eye off your goal.

# Treasurer's Report



This report relates to the period 1 October 1992 to 30 September 1993. Financially, the Club did not progress as expected during the year.

The failure of the major sponsorship promotion undertaken by a group outside of the Club Committee has affected the Club's progress. The promotion raised \$3600 of the \$75000 target.

The income target for the year was \$70200, with the actual figure being \$56950. A breakdown of funding is as follows:

The Club's audited accounts will be available at the Annual General Meeting, scheduled for late November 1993.





The 1989 Annual Report included notes on the sporting lives of Cleve Weatherill, Reg Proctor and Neil Conlan, after whom the Club's perpetual trophies are named. Below is a brief statement of the contribution each made to the Club's development:

First Grade Best and Fairest - Cleve Weatherill Memorial Perpetual

Trophy - Cleve was one of the Club's hard workers in its early years,
winning the Best Clubman award in 1972. He took over as Reserve Grade
coach in the 1974 season and guided them into the Finals series (their
first ever), a success he repeated in 1975 and with the Firsts in
1976. He died in early 1977 after a short illness.

Under 19 Grade Best and Fairest - Reg Proctor Perpetual Trophy - Reg was the Club's Football Treasurer from 1972-1977 and was on the Football Committee for that period and also in 1980 and 1981. He was the Club's timekeeper from 1972 until 1991 and has kept the basic historical records during that period from which the annual statistics included in this report are produced. He was Under 19 co-ordinator in 1981-1986 and has maintained a support for this team throughout most of his involvement with the Club. He won the Best Clubman trophy in 1973 (shared) and 1979, the Club's Merit Award in 1980, was appointed a Life Member in 1985 and was awarded the ACTAFL Certificate of Merit in 1985.

First Grade Most Courageous and Best First Year Player - Neil Conlan Memorial Perpetual Trophies - Neil Conlan coached Belconnen for two months in 1978 before his sudden death, aged 42. He had a long and illustrious career as a coach and player in Tasmania and later with Manuka in the ACTAFL. In 7 years he coached Manuka to 5 premierships. Neil was one of Canberra's outstanding players and coaches.






