## president's report

This year saw the Club turn the corner after many years of hard work. It resulted from the efforts of many committees, who often struggled for survival — largely through lack of support from licensed premises. The previous Committees, who formed the foundation of our Club, deserve recognition as they saw the Club through some of its most testing times. I would particularly like to recognise the personal efforts of John and Denise Molony, Brian and Helen Read, Frank, Joyce, Robert and Helen Goddard, David Bennett and Lesley Daw, Michael and Lily Price and Ray and Diane Baguley. These people kept the Club going where other clubs have folded. They have instilled in the Club an ethos of friendship and loyalty to a common goal — always working towards the light at the end of the tunnel.

This year, all associated with the Club have had a tremendous work ethic and we have achieved a number of firsts for our Club:

- Winning the Club Championship;
- Reaching the finals in all four grades;
- Reaching the First Grade Grand Final for the first time since 1979;
- Winning the Canberra District (Div 2) premiership again;
- Winning the Cock of the North Trophy (Belconnen v Ainslie) on all three outings; and
- Winning the Neil Conlan Memorial Trophy (Belconnen v Eastlake) on all three outings.

There were number of successful initiatives introduced in season 1998. Of course, the most noticeable change was to our playing strip. Players donned the Port Adelaide colours this season — a first for Port Adelaide in that the Port administration has not licensed any other Club in Australia to wear their strip. Other initiatives included:

- Introduction of a uniform for all senior players (which also included the U18 team);
- Introduction of a Players' Newsletter — a regular information sheet to advise players of upcoming events and provide news and information on other Club happenings; and
- Preparation for the launch of the Club's internet site prior to the commencement of the 1999 season.

We need to be sure that the work which commenced in 1971 is continued in 1999 and we strive again to bring home the premiership to

Belconnen. This will not come without hard work and the commitment of all players, officials and supporters. Your commitment will be the price of our success.

I'd like to congratulate all the award winners — particularly Steve Mahar on his second best and fairest win and being the runner-up in the Mulrooney Medal. Congratulations also to George McLachlan for his fine efforts in being the winner of the reserve grade best and fairest — while still being eligible for the U18 team. Tony Stubbs has also had a solid season, capping it off with his third runner-up award in the Development Squad.

I wish to pay particular tribute to:

- Mick Sek for his tireless efforts as our head manager and property officer;
- Rod Cowie, as Chairman of Selectors has a very professional approach to his task and his efforts are much appreciated;
- Adam Ryder for being selected as an all-Australian representative;
- Luke White for being selected and consistently performing well in the RAMS team all year;
- Frank Goddard, for being named *ACT Football Personality of the Year*; and
- Damian and Michelle Tuck on the safe arrival of James.

One of the more difficult decisions in 1997 was that of withdrawing from the U21 competition. I commented at the time that we would await vindication of the decision within twelve months. I believe our decision has been vindicated. I find it refreshing to see the changes this has brought to the senior squad. Steve Harrison has had a huge influx of young players with a fantastic attitude to football. Many of the former under 21s have played a significant number of games this year. In addition, we have had a number of U18 players included in the senior team and development squad. I have been impressed with the attitude of these young players and it has reinforced my view that Belconnen's strength comes from its juniors.

Of course, there is inevitably a drop-off in players with the wrong attitude to football or who have not been committed to the ethos of our Club. Steve Harrison is to be commended on his efforts in drawing out the strengths of our young team and capitalising on our junior depth.

Steve now has a solid base on which to work for the coming seasons.

I would like to recognise the efforts of my fellow committee members, coaching, training and support staff for their work over the season. It must be remembered that the Club could not function without these dedicated people. I'd also like to recognise the efforts of John Kimball, John Burrows, Ray Baguley and the social club directors for their support over the season — this has made my job much easier.

To the players and all our coaches, I would like to express my gratitude for a successful and enjoyable season — we must look at the next

step for season '99. You must remember you belong to the future and the past of our Club and we rely on you to combine striving to take the important next step.

## first grade

At the outset, I would like to thank the Belconnen Football Club for giving me the opportunity to coach at senior level again in the ACTAFL competition. It is refreshing to be involved with a club which believes in developing its juniors and giving them every opportunity to reach their potential.

From our first training run on 4 November 1997, the player numbers and enthusiasm at training suggested that the Club was prepared to do the work necessary to take the step to the next level. Attendance at training averaged 38 in our transition phase and around 50 for the pre-season period. It remained at this number for the rest of the season.

There were some memorable achievements throughout the year, namely beating Ainslie, Eastlake, Weston Creek and Tuggeranong three times; beating Campbelltown for the first time; kicking 30 goals on two occasions; winning two games in a row by one point; the many individual performances; and, of course, making the grand final. Another pleasing factor is that, of the 38 first grade players used during the season, ten were first game players and five of those ten were 18 year-olds.

It is history now that we did not reach our ultimate goal in winning the grand final — going down to Queanbeyan by 16 points. As a Club, I feel we have come a long way in season '98. A more professional approach was taken in all aspects of football, both on and off the field, and it was to the players' credit that they coped with everything which was put to them. I felt we were

good enough to win the grand final, but a bit of inexperience and Queanbeyan's ability to win the ball in the pack situations was probably the difference.

Human nature will tell us that we had a successful year, which is true, but if we sit back and pat ourselves on the back, the football world will go by leaving us in its wake. I feel as a Club, across the board, we will need to improve by at least 25 per cent. Players will need to be stronger, fitter and even more determined in season '99 than in season '98. All ACTAFL clubs will now be more aware of us and will not be treating us as easybeats. We have tasted a bit of success and I'm sure we liked it — let's build on this year to get the Belconnen Football Club up to a standard everyone respects.

In finishing, I would like to thank Peter Taylor, Ray Baguley and Peter Bradley for their support and the passing on of inner knowledge of the philosophies of the Belconnen Football Club. To the Match Committee — Rod, Tony and Paz — and our welfare officer (Puds), all training staff, team managers, committee and supporters — many thanks. I would also like to thank John Burrows and John Kimball for their support from the licensed club. Congratulations to the all trophy winners, our ACT representative players and, most importantly, to all players who represented the Belconnen Football Club — well done. Hopefully, 1999 will be our most successful year.

## development squad

The theme of change adopted this season by the Belconnen Football Club was enthusiastically supported by all.

One of the major changes was the renaming of the Reserve Grade team as the Development Squad — which was evolved because of the young talent within the Club and the need to prepare them for *all* aspects of senior football. I believe the concept was a success in many ways and, with further fine tuning, will become a valuable breeding ground for identifying and developing first grade footballers for the Club over the next few years.

The need for, and the success of, the Development Squad can be demonstrated by:

- 49 players being used in the season;
- 17 players being promoted to the First Grade team for one game or more;
- an amazing 42 players kicking one goal or more in the Squad;
- our youngest player being only 15 years old; and
- of all players relegated to the Squad due to injury or lack of form, 12 managed to find their way back into the senior side.

Every player promoted to the senior team did his job on the day — well done to those players. George McLachlan was our highest goal kicker — with 20 goals.

Our on-field exploits were pretty good this season. We led the competition for the first half of the season, but long term injuries to some key players had a significant impact on us during the last half. We still finished the year third on the ladder, with only percentage separating us from Tuggeranong (who eventually won the competition).

There were some memorable victories during the year — who could forget Neil Donlan's searching run up the wing to score the winning goal against Ainslie (by three points); or the heart-stopping win against Tuggeranong at Greenway? It is important to note that, apart from a ten goal loss to Tuggeranong, the team did not lose

a game by more than three goals late in the season. It was unfortunate to lose the first semi-final to Queanbeyan — whose experienced and physical side were blessed by the weather. The wet and slippery conditions, combined with early injuries that left us without a bench did not help our team. It is, however, no excuse and — as always — a better team won on the day in an extremely close finish. I was very proud of our efforts and the way the team battled the game out.

There are inevitably many people to thank. I would like to thank all the trainers for their efforts over the season (including finals), Barry Collins for being the runner (never an easy job), Paz Rocca for his assistance on the sidelines in the second part of the season, Jim Donlan for managing the team and Rod Cowie for his valuable input. A big thanks to Paul Gunn for the update of vital information during the year. I would also like to give grateful thanks to our supporters who braved trying conditions and, in extreme cases, early starts.

Congratulations to Steve Harrison and all senior players for their acceptance of the Development Squad - both on match days and during training. There was great camaraderie between the two squads which made the transition of players promoted much easier.

Congratulations to award winners and to those who achieved personal milestones for the club — particularly Tony Subbs (250 games), Michael Hassett (150 games) and Kyran O'Shaughnessy (100 games).

Finally, thanks to each and every one of the 49 players who I had the pleasure of coaching this season. A number made the step to first grade — congratulations on this achievement. For the remainder who did not make it into first grade, I believe in you — perhaps more than you believe in yourselves. Work hard on your weights, work hard in the pre-season, take it seriously and your dream can be a reality.

Remember ... winning starts with beginning.

## junior clubs

### belconnen

The Belconnen Junior Australian Football Club continues to grow and mature as a junior sporting club; promoting fun, while learning the skills and associated benefits of sport. This year the club fielded teams in the U9, U10, U11, U13, U14 and U16 age groups. West Canberra and Belconnen junior clubs combined this year to form a very successful Belconnen Magpies U18 team. The club also conducted an AUSKICK clinic held every Saturday morning during the season. Wet weather was particularly disruptive to training — and resulted in a derby game in U14s being abandoned during the match as the torrent crossed Aranda Oval.

The Club introduced a new image with a new jumper design during the season. Adopting the colours of black and teal, with a bit of white, we introduced the jumper in the U16, U14 and U13 teams. The jumper provides a strong link with the senior club. We agree with all observers that the new design looks fantastic. It will be introduced to all age groups progressively in coming years.

Aussie football (U8-U11) is the future of our game. The aim of all coaches and parents in Aussie football is to present the opportunity for players to enjoy and learn and many players in these age groups will eventually play senior football. All players displayed enthusiasm, with many showing football skills way beyond their years. Youth football (U12-U18) encourages the players to play with the specific aims of finals and premiership flags. The U13s continue to mature as young team, not that far away from a finals appearance. The U14s and U16s had very successful seasons, both reaching the Grand Final. The Belconnen Magpies (U18s) did not win the Grand Final, but are to be congratulated for their season.

This year will be remembered as a time when initial and rewarding steps were taken to cement Belconnen as a successful and vibrant football area. With assistance from the senior club and West Canberra junior club we have been able to employ a Junior Development Officer to promote Australian football within our area. Coaching positions were resolved reasonably early this year, although the U13s position was not finalised until close to the first game. All coaches have been accredited at Level 1 as a minimum, which is not only a Club requirement, but also a general development requirement.

Mike Attwell headed a great group which looked after the AUSKICK program. This is the nursery of future sports people — especially for Australian Rules football. The work which is done at this level is greatly appreciated — although I think sometimes the adults had more fun!

The Under 8s were coached by Greg Cassimatis, ably assisted by many. The Under 9s were coached by Shane Harvey, also assisted by many. Both these coaches were first year junior coaches who seemed to enjoy the experience. They were blessed by very good, enthusiastic players who will hopefully be on board again next season. James Dunstan coached the Under 11s and has progressed with this side over the years. Once again the players are enjoying the game and they

will be into the real football next year with premiership points and finals.

Malcolm Fischer coached the Under 12s through a very good season and made a final. This is a great learning experience for the team and is the first age group that can play finals. Rebecca McCaskill was a newly appointed coach who took on the Under 13s. The side did not have great numbers, but played their best and the result against Weston Creek the last time they played, when they had a meritorious victory, is an example for all in the game of football.

The Under 14s were coached by Brett Langham. This side struggled for numbers, but played some very good football in patches and have some very good future footballers in their ranks. The Under 18 combined side, coached by David Fitzgerald and known as the Belconnen Magpies, has been playing in the same playing strip as the senior side. The team finished the year as minor premiers, but were unable to grab the major prize in the junior competition. The contribution of the Belconnen juniors to this side has been greatly appreciated and the team combination was very good.

Congratulations to Ben Edwards for winning the G V Mahoney Award for the League's Best and Fairest U18 player.

The Club has had many representatives at junior level, with Brendan Fischer, Nathan McKinnon and

Tommy Doig making the ACT Primary School side. Brendan was captain of the side — a great honour for him. Other players involved in ACT representative squads included Ben Langham, Ben Turnbull (U14s) and David McPhan (U13s).

The Club, in conjunction with the Belconnen senior and junior clubs, appointed John Williams as the Junior Development Officer. His role was to look after the Belconnen and Gungahlin districts in running (either by himself or with other senior players) hundreds of clinics at schools and he has established a network for future years. While there is sometimes no direct benefit to the junior clubs in clinics, having Australian football promoted in schools is a major platform that all junior and senior clubs should pursue.

I would like to thank the senior players who assisted at training and with AUSKICK. Their presence is good for the junior players and gives them a link to the senior club and aspirations for senior football.

I would like to thank the West Canberra Football Club for their direct support to the development phase of football and the facility of the Club to be able to conduct other junior functions and meetings, etc. Sponsors of the Junior Club are appreciated and this is an area that will be fully addressed within the Junior Club.
