

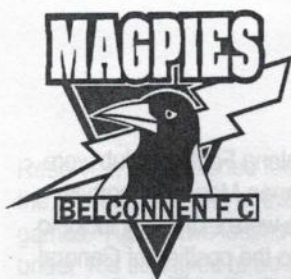

President's Report



Dear Members,

Welcome to my second report as President of the mighty Belconnen Magpies Football Club.

The euphoria of the Geelong win in the 2007 AFL Grand Final

provided me with some food for thought for this report. The Cats had not tasted premiership success for 44 years; they had been in the grand final a number of times over the last 10 years without success and were considered to have a pretty good list and probably underachieved over the last few years. At the end of 2006 there was a significant review at the football club and Mark Thompson considers himself lucky to retain the top job. What does this have to do with the Belconnen Magpies Football Club, you may ask? The circumstances at the Geelong Football Club conspired to create an environment of significant desire for success, both on and off the field. I believe we may have lost that edge off our desire as a football club. The period of success we have had over the last nine years, appearing in the grand final in seven of those years and winning three premierships, has created an air of expectation, rather than the absolute desire, leaving no stone unturned, to achieve premiership success. I think we have been treading water, not continuing to significantly improve, which has allowed other clubs to catch up and pass us. In 2007 we did not make the Premier Division grand final for the first time in many years and we can no longer claim to be the best Canberra based team in the competition, (although I believe this title is little consolation if you are not the best team in the competition!).

Well, this is all looking backward. We now need to focus on the future, work even harder, both on and off the field, to produce the results that we do expect. We have an excellent club coach and support staff, a strong player list, good juniors coming through and a committed board of directors. There is definitely the strong foundation for future success, we just need to regain that desire that drives everyone to do that little bit extra to ensure success.

The changes at the Geelong Football Club were also good for the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. Early this year we were extremely lucky to recruit Garry Davidson to the position of General Manager, direct from the Football Operations Manager role at the Geelong Football Club. Garry has significant recent experience at the AFL level and his experience, knowledge and ideas will be invaluable to the club and will drive us forward.

Before the start of the season the club decided to assist AFL Canberra to conduct a viable Reserve Grade competition by elevating our Canberra District Division 1 team into the Reserves competition. I believe this has not only helped the competition but has exposed a greater number of our footballers to the premier competition, therefore producing greater depth in our playing ranks. I sincerely thank Bernie Williams and all the players for accepting this challenge and playing up at this level. They should be proud of their efforts; being competitive in every game and winning seven. This is a demonstration of the strength and depth of the Belconnen Magpies Football Club and an example of where we are prepared to be a good corporate citizen where other clubs are not.

2007 is a year where we have lost a stalwart of the club. Alan Phillips passed away in June after a brief illness. Alan was the Treasurer of the club until he took leave of absence due to his illness. He was a past player, member of the AFL Canberra Board, a member of the Sports Club Board and a genuine Belconnen Magpie through to the core. Alan will be sadly missed. The Board has decided to name the Club Person of the Year award in honour of his significant contribution to this football club.

Results

Congratulations to the Belconnen Cats under 12's who took out the premiership for their age group. A fantastic effort.

Our First Grade team finished the regular season in second position on the ladder, three games clear of third placed Eastlake. With a good performance in Sydney against the Swans in the last round expectations for the finals were high. Two poor performances in the finals and we were out in straight sets. A similar story for the

Reserves, who finished four games clear on top of the ladder at the end of the home and away games. Again, two losses and we were out. Our under 18s struggled to be competitive, although at times looked the goods, even against the top sides. A number of players eligible for the under 18s have consistently played at a higher level, so the final ladder position is not a true reflection of the younger brigade coming through. With David Bennett's Belconnen Cats Under 16s playing off in the grand final, along with those from the Magpies, it ensures a good crop of youngsters coming into the under 18 ranks.

As mentioned earlier, the club fielded a second reserves team, and not a team in Division 1. The Magpies Reserves acquitted themselves well and this experience should have been beneficial to the players who can approach next year back in Division 1 with much greater confidence. The Division 2 team performed very well also, finishing as runners up. Thanks to Stuart Dunn who took on the role of coach at the start of the season. As always, the girls under coach Ossie Terron enjoyed themselves immensely and were competitive in their games.

Major Initiatives

The Board has progressed the development of improved facilities at the Kippax ovals. Stratcorp has been engaged to develop a master plan, which has sought input from stakeholders—including the facilities design/sources of funding—and is close to finalisation. The timing is right, with the super school development across the road and the cycle of politics, to push hard to see this development come to fruition.

The other major initiative the board has progressed is the new junior structure. A strategic steering committee has been formed with representatives from the Belconnen Cats and Magpies Juniors, along with the senior club, to significantly bolster the junior focus in the Belconnen area. To this end, I welcome Melanie Brothers to the Belconnen Magpies as Junior Football Operations Coordinator. Melanie has a degree qualification in Sports Management and a strong background in the sports industry. With the new strategic steering committee in place and Melanie's appointment, junior football will now get the attention it deserves.

Management and Leadership

There have been a few changes at the board level, with Brock Weston and Aaron Tyndall retiring and being replaced with Jo Foster and Sean Egan. Thanks to all directors (Ray Baguley – Vice President and acting Treasurer, Dannie Baguley – Secretary, Stacey Beevor and Jo Foster – Functions and Events, Scott Reid – Game Day Logistics, Brendan Read – Junior Development, Norm Simms – Property and Equipment, Justin Lalor – Public Relations and Communications, Garry Davidson – General Manager and recently Sean Egan) for their continued input and long hours to ensure the football club operates effectively.

Steve Mahar, Tony Mahar, Michael Horne, Bernie Williams, Daryl Read, Jason Kidney and Garry Davidson have led the senior squad very well and received compliments from the Swans coaching staff on their game plan employed against them in Sydney. Brett Langham took the reins of the under 18s and must have been wondering what he got himself into at times throughout the year. Well done Brett on your work this year. The work the club undertakes in the junior area should improve the transition of players from junior football to the senior club and improve the performances of this age group.

The long awaited review into the operations of AFL Canberra has been finalised, although at the time of writing has not been released. The competition next year is to again take the same form as this year with the Swans expected to participate again, as well as Tuggeranong and the Wildcats, along with the other established clubs in first grade. This will again see a seven team competition at this level. Once the report becomes available, further information will be provided to members.

Finances

The football club is projecting a small loss for 2006-07, with the audited financial report due to be tabled at the Annual General Meeting. The small loss is predominantly due to the non budgeted expenses to date for the facilities project. This strong financial position is predominantly due to the substantial input from the licensed club and our valued sponsors.

Improving the sponsorship base is an area of attention for 2008. We will continue to work to ensure our sponsors get a return on their investment. Improving the sponsorship level will ensure the club's ongoing viability and also allow us to continue to pursue significant major initiatives to build on the professionalism of the club.

I must acknowledge the significant support of Bob Garrett and the Sports Club Board. Without this fantastic support the club just could not operate.

To our wonderful band of volunteers, our trainers led by Peg Townley, team managers – Mal Townley, Lyall Camp, Ivan Woods, Ben Ryan and Jeremy Foster, the water carriers, the runners, statisticians, video operators and all others who have helped out during the year I sincerely thank you. Without the dedicated and hard working volunteers the club could not function.

To all the supporters, whether you are a past player, friend, relative or loved one of a player, I thank you for turning out and supporting the Belconnen Magpies Football Club. We need to see you all at the games again next year.

Finally, a big thank you to Justin and Shae Lalor (for the second year running) and to Cathey Kelly, who have worked extremely hard to put this report together.

Congratulations to all the award winners and I will see you at the football in 2008.

Treasurer's Report



It is with much sadness that I table this report for your consideration. This has been the duty of Alan Phillips for a number of years and his professional handling of the Club's accounts will be missed.

The audited statements will be available at the Annual General Meeting to be conducted in late November, however, I can report on several key indicators of our operation.

Income for the year will be approximately \$520,000 of which nearly \$400,000 is made available by the Belconnen Magpies Sports Club grant. As you can see it would be impossible to fund football in the Belconnen district to the level that we do without the Sports Club grant. The Sports Club also assists in many other ways and I thank Bob Garrett, Jon Burrows and other Board members for their generous support.

The other \$120,000, a significant amount, is derived from sponsors, functions, raffles and registration fees. The input from our sponsors is vital to our ongoing success. Not only do they provide much needed cash but they also provide employment for recruits, sometimes at very short notice, plus they also supply various networking opportunities. If you can support them, please do, if not, just thank them.

Most of our income (\$340,000) is expended on administrators, coaches, players, trainers and other personnel. Other key items of expenditure are AFL Canberra levies, equipment, ground hire, insurances and travelling costs.

To all the volunteers, in particular the Football Club Board a huge thank you for your input, as without your willingness to help, the burden on our paid staff would be too great and they simply would not be able to get the job done.

The Football Club front office now consists of two-and-a-half people whereas it was a one person operation less than a year ago. This recruitment is a result of our desire to take on extra tasks particularly with our juniors and to increase our professionalism across all other areas. Therefore I urge our many, many volunteers to keep up the

good work and support Garry, Mel and Cathey as much as you can.

To Garry Davidson and his team, thanks for your endeavors, I am very aware of the effort that is applied and I do appreciate it.

A significant development this year was to allocate \$30,000 towards the development of a Master Plan to significantly upgrade the facilities at Kippax Oval. This money has come from funds accumulated over previous years, plus an input from the Sports Club.

In concluding, it is pertinent to emphasise that there are many projects that we could spend money on and no doubt they would enhance our operation, but we have to be able to fund them without putting our future at risk. It is fair to say that we must continue to be prudent with our expenses and find new revenue streams to fund new projects.

Lets see you all at the footy again next year.

- A genuine / passionate football 'Family' of current day players, volunteers and past players who have enormous passion to want the best results on and off the field
- A junior development process that has rolled along with junior club enthusiasm but lacking in direction
- A coaching group that work cohesively and enthusiastically but requiring direction with a game plan, player development and re-shaping a club culture that ensures future success from U18s to Seniors
- A Board that is enthusiastic about its role but looking for more support with people who have 'spare' time to fulfil the Boards function to its maximum potential
- Volunteers who are committed to the cause and would like more to help ease their load

- Policy and procedural documentation and database information deficiencies
- A group of sponsors who show enormous loyalty to 'their' Club
- A uniqueness with a womens' footy team, Canberra District level footy teams and a 2nd Reserves team in the same competition (a great effort)

Plenty to work on, plenty to achieve, rewards for all when achieved!!

The Preliminary Final this year clearly showed me that as a total club we need to challenge ourselves and determine where we improve and move forward and go past Eastlake and Queanbeyan and strongly challenge and defeat the Swans.

On this day I felt a lack of urgency and intensity required for a "do or die" game of footy where you could not come back next week to redress tactics, team selection, training drills and player attitude if you've lost. Queanbeyan came to play! Magpies??

For me, this is the starting point for 2008!

It is imperative that we develop a solid plan, team rules and key performance indicators that drive both the coaching staff and players to strive for continual improvement against all teams in the AFL Canberra Premiership Division.

Administratively we will improve and significant gains have already been made. Cathey Kelly as part-time Football Department Administrator has been a significant appointment to support and guide the football operations of the club. She has drive, a great work ethic and importantly wants the club to succeed.

Melanie Brothers, as Full-Time Junior Football Operations Coordinator (commenced 27 Sept) will be driving our new Junior Football Strategic Plan that will be a significant part of the new Junior Football Strategic Planning Group chaired by ex-President Peter Bradley. Our future is most definitely in this area and critical to a strong club.

Sponsorship in 2007 has been quite solid and a Sponsorship Working group has already discussed 2008 renewals and opportunities that allow us to fund these new positions and other

The timeline for the Master Plan, together with its 'business case' is to be completed late October, and then to be presented to the ACT Government for support for it to be part of the 2008 / 2009 Budget process.

The Master Plan Working Group is very happy with current progress and unequivocal support from all other stakeholders who will benefit enormously if we achieve the desired result.

The Belconnen Magpies rely on so many people that give their time and energy to see it succeed. I am loathe to individualise in this report for fear of missing someone! Throughout other reports these people are mentioned and listed in our Football Staff page and I sincerely thank them for their time and energy in 2007, and do hope you are back for 2008.

All award winners are to be congratulated for what is the club's recognition of your efforts and good performances over the 2007 season. We hope 2008 is another step forward for you!

2008 will be a great challenge for the Belconnen Magpies as we strive to:

- Have the Master Plan funded
- Drive the Junior Development Strategic Plan
- Rejuvenate our U18 squad and program
- Engage a fitness and conditioning coordinator for pre-season
- Welcome Club Doctor Dr Wilson Lo
- Initiate a coaching and development plan that drives our club past all others in Canberra
- Further develop our administrative processes, policies and procedures
- Reshape and re-establish a winning culture at the club.

- Provide professional support for all 6 teams.

First Grade Report



While the 2007 season did not grace us with premiership glory, I believe it will hold us in good stead for years to come. We made great advancements by continuing to develop our playing list, fielding 38 players of whom 19 were aged 21 or under. We also improved the

way we prepare for and recover from games. Ice baths, tights, nutrition and hydration were all new to the group and to the players' credit they embraced each of these concepts to ensure their bodies would be in the best possible condition for the following week. These steps have been implemented as part of our strategy toward professionalism which is crucial to our ability to challenge the top teams in the AFL Canberra competition.

The theme of war was used throughout the season to draw the players' focus toward the link between each week's battle and the ultimate goal of winning the war, or in our terms the AFL Canberra Premiership. Players and coaching staff alike drew strength and motivation from some of Australia's iconic battles. Development Squad (Reserve Grade) Report



Unfortunately my summary for 2007 is again one of great disappointment and frustration, given our season proper dominance resulted in two narrow finals losses to go out in straight sets for the second consecutive year. In addition, the senior team bowing out on

the same day only heightens this frustration given the talented group we have at the club.

The learning curve from 2007 is probably aligned to the ability of maintaining form, fitness and discipline right until the very last minute of a Grand Final and not leaving it at Round 18, 19 or 22.

As a group we had strong belief and a strong focus throughout the year on a premierships opportunity. It was only at that very moment I witnessed a Tuggeranong player kick a goal from 35 metres out on a 45 degree angle (from a 50 metre penalty) to put them 2 points up with only a few minutes left on the clock that I realised how quickly 10 months hard work and planning can be eroded—and how it is so important to maintain composure and stick to the little things we practice and practice all year.

As a club and a group we need to work on being predictable and familiar to each other on the ground and believe in each others' ability and strengths. Season 2007 is said and done and we can only use it as fuel to improve and encourage each other to achieve more moving forward.

Overall, the group put up with a lot of distractions and unsettling selection issues with almost every player who played Development Squad this year playing a game in our Third Grade, who were fantastically competitive all year in Reserve Grade. It is a credit to the club's player depth that we fielded two extremely tough sides to compete each week against all the other AFL Canberra clubs.

Thanks to all who have supported me through the year on and off the field and I will ensure I mention all of you on Presentation Night. As a player you

tend to turn up an hour or so before the game, get ready, play and then go the club and have a beer—but you don't realise how much time and effort goes into fielding our teams each weekend and the preparation that so many individuals put into it.

Well done to all the award winners for 2007 and here is to a much more successful 2008 for the whole club.

Under 18's Report (Third Grade) Report

We started the 2007 season with a basic goal to win more games than we lost. Playing the first game at Greenway against the Hawks, knowing they would be a real force at the end of the year, we went down by 5 goals. After losing the next three games to Ainslie, Marist and Queanbeyan, the goals we set were starting to look hard to reach. In Round 5 we had Eastlake at Manuka and we won by 3 goals in an average game by both teams, however, when we played Eastlake again the following week they belted us by 13 goals.

After this game we had to go back to basics at training where the attendance was good. On average all year we had 24 but the playing group had to work on hand speed, decision making, their disposal, controlled aggression—absolutely all aspects of their game.

The rest of the season was spent bringing this training into our game each Saturday. With patience and some game day disappointment it slowly started to work—not fast enough to realise our original goals—but our game certainly developed into real footy. So much so, that when we played Queanbeyan in the last round at Margaret Donoghue, after being touched up by 16 goals in Round 8 and 23 goals in Round 15, we got within 2 goals. We still lost but our game had improved and we were matching it with the better teams (Queanbeyan finished minor premiers). We ran out of rounds to make a difference, so as you could imagine the playing group had a tough season and I want to congratulate them on being patient with the work we were doing at training because it wasn't always easy.

Our playing group consisted of 11 players from last season, 3 new players to the club (2 of these had not played before), 8 from the Cats Juniors and 6 from the Magpies Juniors.

Through the season we had 6 players play up in Reserve grade, Michael Cain, Stephen Coate, Trent Fernandez, Mathew Newman, Luke Smeaton and Mathew Viney. There were 4 players that came up from the 16s to have a run—Joel Byatt, Brendon Elwood, Scott Langham, and Jake Low.

There were also 6 eligible players from 1st and

Reserve Grade that could have put us easily in finals. What we are doing, however, is developing these and other young players to reach their full potential. Matt Byatt, Jon Dunn, Mick Foster, Stuart Gilchrist, Sean Hanily and Tristan Irvine have made a big contribution to the results in the higher grades.

We had a weekend away over the June long weekend. It was an eventful trip on a property outside of Braidwood with the accommodation not quite reaching 1 full star. Team activities started at 7.00am on the Saturday (just as the rain started), ranging from archery, bushwalking (with a few added challenges), to carting garbage bags full of water around a flooded Motocross track, four wheel driving, 'Red Faces' by the light of a raging camp fire and some motor bike riding for those who could handle the slippery conditions. A good time was had by all.

I would like to congratulate the award winners as we didn't have too much to sing about after most games, but your hard work stood out—so well done. To the players that don't get up to receive an award I hope you got a lot out of the season in bonding with a new group that you now call your mates and finding some hidden strengths in yourself and your game.

I can't go without mentioning Lyall Camp, our team manager. Well done to Skip and the Fourth Grade side for making the grand final for the second year running. You provided great support to us all season and I thank all of you for your hard efforts.

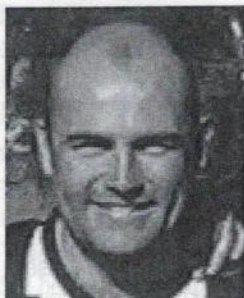
