### President's Report

We enjoyed a successful night at the League awards night this year with Shane Harris taking home the Mulrooney Medal for the NEAFL Eastern Conference best and fairest player. Congratulations also to Elise O'Dea who won the Women's league best and fairest, and Division 1 coach Damian Carmichael who won the AFL Canberra coach of the year award.

Off field the club went from strength to strength. Our administration and operations were capably managed by General Manager Cam Campbell. Our media and communications continued to improve with a new website, regular newsletters and social media eagerly followed. Our Functions & Events coordinator, Matt Hammond, continued to raise the bar for our corporate days. Our Kick In 4 Kippax raceday was a huge success and once again our Long Lunch proved to be a hit as the feature event on our calendar.

In the community we have supported multiple Westfield charity collection days as well as winning the largest club/group participating in the Ben Donohoe Fun Run Walk charity event. Our recruitment committee of Rod Cowie, Brock Weston, Ray Baguley and Cam Campbell ensured we added some talent to our list this season. All new players to the club acquitted themselves well and showed why we were chasing them. Looking ahead the committee are once again working hard as we aim to add 1 or 2 top talents to our developing local talent.

This year the committee has put considerable time into developing a strategic plan for the club. Though still in development this plan is focused on providing opportunities for NEAFL success at the top end, but also opportunities for participation and community engagement for all Belconnen Magpies people. ### Treasurer's Report



Every year is a challenge to manage the Club's budget and this year was no exception. We set the budget for the year coming and try to manage the ups and downs throughout the year. This year we set the budget for the Club to run at a loss of \$32,000. Why run at a loss I hear you ask? Over several years the Club has accumulated profits known as retained earnings. We decided to reduce the level of retained earnings to a more sensible level.

Comparing this year's budget to last year's, there were significant increases in the player and coaching budget, while we had a drop off in sponsorship revenue. This was mostly due to our sponsors generously contributing to the Kick in for Kippax Fund and not being able to commit to the same level with sponsorship. We expect however that sponsorship will recover next year.

We were happy with the outcomes of the inaugural Magpies race day and the Long Lunch functions this year, expertly run by Cam, Hammo and Trina. The golf day was in my opinion slightly disappointing and we will probably move it to October next year and start it at midday rather than 7am.

I'm looking forward to watching the Club play at Kippax Oval next year. The Kick in for Kippax fund has raised \$143,000 from supporters over the last year or so, which is an enormous amount to raise. We have targeted numerous things to spend this money on including a fantastic scoreboard, coaches boxes, extra seating, a shed, and a canteen fit-out to name a few.

Next year the grant from the Sports Club is reducing by \$75,000, which is a significant amount as you can appreciate. Trade at the Sports Club has levelled off over the last few years but the footy grant has just kept increasing over the same period of time. The decision to reduce the grant to a more sustainable level is a sound business decision and the Club fully supports it.

Obviously, the decision to reduce the grant is going to have a significant impact on next year's budget.

Certainly not an insurmountable challenge and I am confident we will manage the budget well. We are going to have to cut back in some areas, and raise more revenue from functions, sponsorship, raffles, rego fees etc. To maintain and increase our competiveness in the NEAFL competition we are committed to keeping the player and coaching budget the same as this year.

We are a values driven club and one of our values is for everyone to be responsible for making this Club a success. So if that means doing more around the club or offering your services please think about doing so. There is going to be more things to do now we have our own home ground and it will only be a success if we get more people involved.

I would like to thank Daryl for his outstanding job as President, a tireless worker, and someone who continually makes sacrifices for this Club. And he is not alone, all our volunteers do a magnificent job and I would also like to thank them. Finally thanks to Cam, Hammo and Sav who have done a terrific job this year.

### Junior Football Operations Report



2012 has been a very successful year for Junior Development it has seen another increase in player numbers, the club roll out a variety of new initiatives and the first amalgamation at the Under 14s level. For me personally, I have thoroughly enjoyed getting down to junior trainings and games and watching kids develop both the on field and off field skills. I really look forward to what 2013 has to offer junior football.

#### **Junior Football**

Between both junior clubs this season we were able to fill sides in all age groups in all divisions which is a fantastic achievement. All credit should be given to both junior clubs and their committees. Special mentions must go to Steve Porter & Jamie Browne's U14's division 1 side that made the grand final, it's a wonderful effort which shouldn't be underestimated. Congratulations to Greg Cassimatis on winning the AFL Canberra Joe McDonald Volunteer of the year award. You have been around a fair while now and have been a great help to me not only in my role now, but when I was a junior coming through - you are a great asset for junior football.

A special mention must go out to all volunteers from both clubs, quite simply games of footy wouldn't happen if it wasn't for all volunteers playing there part, so thank you. To both junior clubs, thank you for having the senior players down to your training throughout the year, the boys thoroughly enjoy coming down to help out and will be looking to do more of it next season.

#### Under 14's & Under 16s

2012 saw the Magpies Juniors and Belconnen Cats amalgamate for the first time from Under 14s through to Under 16s. The Junior Strategic Group thought this was a step we needed to take to ensure all players got the development best suited to them. The Under 14s saw three teams take to the field each week while the Under 16s saw two. I know it's not easy for players to come together from two different clubs so to all players from 14s – 16s well done you should be proud of your efforts. I would also like to acknowledge all parents for embracing the amalgamation concept if it wasn't for you taking the boys to and from training and games this idea would never have worked so thank you.

#### **School Participation**

In 2012, the Belconnen Magpies Football Club along with AFL NSW/ACT were able to conduct AFL clinics in 18 out of 23 Primary Schools, with 5 of the 18 schools booking in clinics multiple days a week which meant AFL was introduced to over 3500 children in the Belconnen region. I would like to thank Cameron James and staff from AFL NSW/ACT, without their assistance we would not of been able to have had such an amazing impact in the Belconnen area. I would also like to thank all School Ambassadors for their assistance throughout the year it's fantastic to see so many passionate AFL people in our schools.

#### Development

It was another fantastic year in junior development for the Belconnen Cats, Magpies Juniors & the Belconnen region as a whole. Following on from the success of last year's Term 2 After School Auskick we again ran centres out of St Michaels primary and Latham primary having over 35 participants across both centres. We, along with AFL NSW/ACT, will also be running a Term 4 Auskick super centre at UC ovals - so watch out for that.

We also rolled out two very successful school holiday programs at Kingsford Smith School one being held over the April School Holiday period which was attended by over 50 participants the other was held over the October School Holiday period and was again attended by over 50 participants. The children were exposed to a variety of different sports including AFL, Soccer, Touch Football & Basketball. We thoroughly enjoy running the school holiday programs and think there will be a lot of future players to come out of them. Both programs will be back in 2013, so please keep a look out.

The Belconnen Academy will be back again in mid to late November the program will be split in two this year with the 11-13 year olds doing a 5 week program pre-Christmas and the 14-17 year olds doing a 5 week program post-Christmas. The Belconnen Academy is aimed at exposing players who have missed out on representative sides to the best coaching available and to help fast track their development, so please again look out for this program.

In 2012, we also rolled out the Belconnen Magpies Coaches Forum this event was held at the AIS and was targeted at coaches from both the junior clubs and the senior club. The initiative was first thought of in 2011 but never came to fruition, the Junior Strategic Group then tabled it again and was aimed to give coaches the chance to learn new skills so they could apply them to their own club/team. The night was very well received

by all and was attended by over 25 coaches it had special guest presenters such as Steve Mahar, Matthew Lokan, John Harper, Jason Saddington, Darren Denneman and Tadhg Kennelly.

I would like to also mention Lisa Bell, Lauren Anderson, Margo, Chad and the Magpies Trainers for all their effort.
